

Phase Two - Cholesterol Management

To support practices, we have created several useful resources.
These include: Clinical Searches, Treatment Guidance and Information for Patients.



The Challenge

The estimated adult population across West Yorkshire and Harrogate with a 10-year CVD risk > 20% **not treated** with a statin is **90,000**.

If this project identified and treated 10%, **9,000** people would receive treatment and an estimated **225 to 400 CVD events** would be prevented over the next 5 years.



The Ask

Phase two of the West Yorkshire and Harrogate Healthy Hearts project focuses on optimising cholesterol management in patients who are on a **low-intensity statin**, and **initiating treatment** in patients with a CVD risk >10% who are currently not on a statin (or those that have had the offer of a statin previously and may now benefit).



How

1. Practice to review and implement **treatment guidance**.
2. Determine the best **approach** e.g. statin switches first
3. Review and run the **searches** which are on SystemOne and EMIS
4. Ensure all clinicians and administrative **staff are clear** on the work and process
5. Use the cholesterol system **template** which includes **patient letters**
